Rules

- Check-in for entries will begin at 5:30PM; all entries must be registered by 7PM
- Entries shall be placed out of public access in an enclosed room no later than 7PM
- Limit of ONE entry per person per category
- Items shall each be assigned a sequential number as they are registered
- There will be 6 judges comprised of faculty and staff: 3 from the medical school, 3 from the law school
 - Judges will arrive in law school room 5229 by 7:05PM
- ◦ These 6 judges will be split into (2) groups of 3 judges each
 - Each group will have either 2 judges from law & 1 judge from med or 2 judges from med & 1 judge from law and be assigned group 'A' and group 'B'
 - Group A will judge for taste on all ODD numbered entries, and will judge for presentation on all EVEN numbered entries
 - Group B will judge for taste on all EVEN numbered entries, and will judge for presentation on all ODD numbered entries
- After all entries have been judged, the 3 highest scoring entries within each section will be awarded points
- After the competition has been judged, the room will open to the public to sample items for a \$1 donation
- Chocolate is allowed
- Recipes need not be original
- Items MUST be baked at some point
- There will be two sections: desserts and non-desserts. Clarification as to what constitutes a dessert or a non-dessert will be provided by the event coordinators, though final determination will be at the discretion of the judges.
 - Broad categorization

- Dessert Baked Goods: cakes, pies, brownies, cookies, cinnamon rolls, cupcakes
- Non-Dessert Baked Goods: breads, muffins, quiches.
- Each section will have a 1st through 5th place winner.
- All judges will score based on the criteria sheet provided. If there is a tie, the judges will vote between the tied products and majority rules in order to determine the winner.
